Libraries, schools, museums/historical societies, community centers, art groups, prisons and other tax-exempt organizations are eligible to take part.

If we select your organization, we'll pay the speaking fee. You'll be responsible for contacting and scheduling the assigned speaker, paying any travel expenses (including mileage and hotel if needed), providing the venue and handling local publicity.

Applications open **Friday, May 11** and close **Friday, July 6**. You will be notified the week of July 15 for programs beginning August 1 or later. All speaking engagements must be completed by **December 31, 2018.** Special consideration is given to organizations who have **not** already received funds through other *One State / One Story: Frankenstein* grant opportunities.
